.DAY ONE...Today and Tonight

Heat indices up to 105 degrees are expected areawide this afternoon
and evening. A few thunderstorms are possible this afternoon into
tonight across mainly central Kansas. The strongest thunderstorms
may produce wind gusts near 60 mph.

.DAYS TWO THROUGH SEVEN...Wednesday through Monday

Triple digit heat indices are expected across southern Kansas on
Wednesday.

On-and-off thunderstorm chances will continue Wednesday through

early next week. A few strong to severe storms are possible during this period. Additionally, locally heavy rainfall may lead to some flooding concerns, especially across portions of eastern Kansas.

* WHAT...Heat index values up to 105.

* WHERE...Portions of central, east central, south central, and
southeast Kansas.

* WHEN...Until 8 PM CDT this evening.

* IMPACTS...Hot temperatures and high humidity may cause heat
illnesses.

PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...

Take extra precautions when outside. Wear lightweight and loose fitting clothing. Try to limit strenuous activities to early morning or evening. Take action when you see symptoms of heat exhaustion and heat stroke.

To reduce risk during outdoor work, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration recommends scheduling frequent rest breaks in shaded or air conditioned environments. Anyone overcome by heat should be moved to a cool and shaded location. Heat stroke is an emergency! Call 9 1 1.
